Roman Cue Bids and Slam Bidding

For this presentation/class assume our methods are 2/1 Game Force and RKCB 1430.

(Please adjust accordingly for your own preferences)

With Standard Slam Bidding Conventions and Style

assuming a knowledge of Blackwood, Gerber and RKC,

one partner takes control and everything from then onwards, the auction is robotic and automatic.

But with Roman Cue Bids Style

There is a conversation or discussion between partners.

Example:

A Jxxx AKQxx QJx

KQx AKQxxx x xxx

1D-1H

3H-3S

(**3S** = maybe something bigger, lets talk)

Rules:

1) Suit agreed..... at least 8 cards.

2) New suit is a control. CHEAPEST control/ Ace or King/ singleton or void.

3) Skipping a suit below game= no first or second round control.

IMPORTANT!!!

Other examples:

J10xx AKQx xx J10x

Partner open 1S and you bid 3S. Partner bids 4D and you say?????

NOT 4H because he denied a club control when he bid 4d, because you are bidding CONTROLS UP THE LINE !!!!

Partner had AKQxxx x AKQ xxx. What a stop in 4S! **But, your Italian style cue bids did the trick.**

Another:	(you)	AQxx Qxx AKxx Qx
	(partner)	KJ10xxx xxx QJ AK
	(auction)	1NT -2H
		3S - 4C
		4D - 4S (denies heart control)
Next:		KQxx KQ xx AQxxx AJxxx xx Axx KJx
		1C-1S
		3S-4C
		4H-4N
		5S -6 S

Learning of partner's H control, responder can then RKC and getting 2 and trump Q, just enough for slam.

We will now develop a helpful convention in these forcing auctions.

Sometimes when neither partner has any extra strength nor source of tricks, a hopeless slam may be bid.

THE SOLUTION:

SERIOUS 3NT

When?

- -- Auction is game forcing.
- -- MAJOR suit agreed
- Bidding is at the 3-level

Then never play 3NT with 8 or more cards in a MAJOR

Auction: 1S-2C (game force) 2S-3S ??

CHOICES:

- **1. 3NT -- SERIOUS slam try/partner is forced to q bid**
- 2. Cue-bid -- Not enough for SERIOUS 3NT, but decent values.
- **3.** 4S-- a really bad hand in context (does not deny a control, but does show a hand that discourages slam).

This method gives the player 3 ways to express an opinion (serious, polite interest, no interest).

4 Hands to illustrate these concepts.

1) AJxxx xxx Axx Ax Kxx AKx QJxxx xx

> 1S-2D 2NT-3S 4C-4S pass.

- 4C: bypassing 3NT shows a minimum hand. Partner then simply bids the game.
- 4H: shows extras and says "Don't care if you are minimum, we may still have slam".

The inferences drawn from a failure to bid Serious 3NT are important and should be kept in mind.

2) AJxxx xxx Axx Ax KQx AKx QJxxxx x 1S-2D 2NT-3S 4C-4H 4NT-5S

5NT-6S

Opener did NOT use Serious 3NT and after 4H, his hand is a monster! He uses RKC to the good slam.

3) AJ10xx QJx xx KQx KQx AKx QJxxxx x 1S -2D 2NT-3S 4C -4H 4S -Pass

Opener knows they are off 2D tricks, attempts to sign off and partner agrees.

4) AQJxx Qx Ax Axxx Kxx AKx QJxxxx x 1S -2D 2NT-3S 3NT-4C 4D -4H 4NT-5H

6S -pass

Here, the Serious 3NT first gets the encouraging 4C and then, after 4D, the ensuing 4H is exactly the thing he wanted to hear. Slam is reached.
